The Border Patrol's National BB Gun Match will be held on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Announcements will be made as to times and other information. The Tournament Director reserves the right to make changes to this schedule at any time during the Rocky Mountain Nationals if needed. The Statistical Office will be open at 7:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday to accept late entries for the rest of the matches. Entries can also be made before the matches start each day.

Program Amendment Note: On May 8, 2018 the Charlie Pirtle Semi-Auto Regional was amended to add Distinguished Production Match 24. Separate Distinguished Production relays will not be added. Competitors can elect to fire EITHER Distinguished Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 18 OR Distinguished Production Match 24.

RANGE FEES—There is a daily range fee of \$15.00 that will be paid to the Whittington Center by the match. On Tuesday, range fees will be collected by the Statistical Office from the competitors who practice that day. Each competitor regardless of whether or not he/she is a member must pay the Whittington Center match fee of \$15.00 per day during the scheduled Rocky Mountain Nationals match days. Questions can be directed to the Whittington Center Office staff or the STAT OFFICE. Memberships (lifetime or annual) can be purchased at the Whittington Center Office.

GOVERNING RULES: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at **ppc.nra.org.**

ELIGIBILITY:

Law Enforcement: Open to any eligible law enforcement member as outlined in Police Pistol Combat Rule Section 2.4. These include active and retired Law Enforcement Officers, and <u>full time</u> Police Firearms Instructors, Transit Police, Penal Institution Guards, Industrial Police which includes Bank Guards and

Armored and Express Company Guards, and Military Police. Federal Flight Deck Officers who hold valid certifications are also eligible.

NRA Membership is not required for any NRA competitions but is encouraged. A special law enforcement discount form for NRA Membership and Renewal will be available at check in for law enforcement members.

Civilians: Any non-commissioned NRA member over the age of 18 is eligible to compete in this class provided he/she can do so safely under the same conditions as the classified police competitors. U.S. competitors must be sponsored by a CLASSIFIED PPC COMPETITOR. The Tournament Director reserves the right to disqualify any civilian competitor if he/she feels this competitor cannot safely compete under the same conditions as the classified police competitors. The civilian competitors will compete against each other for awards if there is a sufficient number in this group. This group will be squadded separately from the classified police competitors. The scores fired will not be reported to the NRA and no NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification Cards will be issued as a result of these scores fired.

<u>CLASSIFICATIONS</u>: Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications, new shooters with no Classification, or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will be registered in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2. Competitors may check their current NRA Classification at **lecompetitions.nra.org.**

SQUADDING: All individual matches and team matches will be squadded by the STAT OFFICE.

<u>TEAM MATCHES</u>: The Team Matches in the New Mexico State Championship (Wednesday) and the Charlie Pirtle Regional (Friday) must be fired with Semi-Automatic Pistols. The Team Matches in the Colorado State Championship (Thursday) and the Charlie Pirtle Regional (Saturday) must be fired with Revolvers. All team scores will be eligible for National Records.

Team Matches in Tournaments will consist of two or four firing members per NRA Rule 2.7 and a Team Captain. The Team Captain may be a competing member of the team. Teams will be Classified per NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule 19.16. NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule 2.8 requires that all team members <u>must be from the same agency</u>. Membership can include officers retired from the agency if they are not now employed by another eligible agency. Eligible Military competitors who are also regular full time law enforcement, industrial law enforcement, or reserve/auxiliary law enforcement must sign up with other members <u>from their law enforcement agency</u>. No "pick-up" teams are allowed.

A competitor may fire on both a 2-person and a 4-person team but cannot fire on two different 4-person teams or 2-person teams. An agency may enter as many 2-person teams as it wishes, however, each 2-person team may fire only once.

For Awards Purposes, Teams will be categorized into two groups--group A consisting of High Master and Master teams and group B consisting of Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, and Classified Teams in the New Mexico and Colorado State Championships.

SCHEDULE OF AWARDS

Guns, Merchandise or Cash Awards will be presented to the OVERALL AGGREGATE winner in each Classification. To be eligible for this award, a competitor must fire in the Open Class Matches of all four Tournaments, the Stock Service Semi-Automatic Match, the Undercover Match, the Stock Service Revolver Match and both Distinguished Matches. The total aggregate for all the matches will determine the winner. Competitors will be Classified based on their combined NRA Classifications.

Merchandise or cash awards will be given in the Stock Service Revolver, Undercover Revolver, Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol, Distinguished Revolver, and Distinguished Semi-Automatic Pistol Matches.

Team awards will be given in each class (regional) or category (other matches) of competition.

Merchandise or cash awards will be given in the Annie Oakley and Kit Carson matches.

Competitors in the USBP BB gun match will be broken down into age groups again as last year and all of the kids will go home with great awards.

TARGETS: Official NRA B-27 Targets and Repair Centers will be used.

SCORING: Scoring will be done off the line by competitors. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Tournament Official to score the targets. PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors.

Competitors will inspect their own targets after scoring, check their score card for correctness and sign their score card to indicate acceptance of the score.

Score cards must be signed and are FINAL once signed so **PLEASE** double check the recorded hits and values BEFORE signing. Accepted score cards will be checked by the Statistical Office and posted on the Match Results Bulletin Board. Competitors must sign their scorecards or risk not having scores accepted.

<u>CHALLENGES & PROTESTS</u>: If the competitor wants to Challenge the scoring, they must inform the Chief Range Officer immediately, complete the Challenge Form and pay the Challenge Fee. The fee will be refunded if the Challenge is ruled in favor of the shooter. Challenges will be processed following NRA PPC Rule 16.1.

Challenges to Preliminary Bulletins must be made within one hour of the Posting Time.

RESULT BULLETINS: Final Result Bulletins will be provided to all competitors.

<u>FIREARMS AND EQUIPMENT</u>: Please see NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book Section 3 for firearm and equipment specifications. If a competitor is uncertain about any firearm or equipment being eligible they must contact the Tournament Director or NRA Match Supervisor for a decision prior to firing.

AMMUNITION: No high speed or Magnum ammunition will be allowed. Ammunition must be loaded to produce sufficient velocity to pass through the target AND the backer. Shots that do not pass through the target and the backer will be scored as misses.

Open Class Division Firearms: Either hand loaded or factory loaded ammunition may be used. Wadcutter ammunition is allowed.

Stock Duty Gun Division Firearms and Distinguished Firearms: Either hand loaded or factory loaded ammunition may be used. No wadcutter ammunition is allowed

<u>COURSES OF FIRE</u>: The Range Officer will announce the course of fire, shooting positions and time prior to the start of each Match and Stage. Time will start with a loaded gun in holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun or holster until the command to commence firing is given.

All loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders, or special pouch. To force reloading under time restraints, magazine loading is limited to 6 rounds per magazine. There is no limit on the number of magazines you have but all used during the firing of a stage or string MUST be on your person. It is the competitors' responsibility to have sufficient ammunition in their possession to complete the Match being fired.

A conventional right or left-hand holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holster cannot be tied down.

Optical Devices: No optical devices other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight or Sunglasses will be permitted on the range during Match firing for use by competitors. Use of a mechanical iris, eye patch or eye cover is also prohibited.

The Statistical Office will be open at 7:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday to accept late entries for the rest of the matches. Entries can also be made before the start each day.

Annie Oakley & Kit Carson Match

Shooters who have ever held NRA classifications or who are Commissioned Officers are not eligible as well as shooters competing in the Civilian Class in any of the Tournaments are not eligible for this Match. Competitor Eligibility and Classification is subject to the discretion of the Tournament Director.

Each shooter must have a coach. Each shooter will draw from his/her own holster and may be assisted in loading by the coach.

Any Revolver that is eligible for any of the Open Class or Stock Service Matches may be used.

Competitors will be divided into two groups, Those who are under 17 years of age and those who are 17 years of age and over. The match director reserves the right to place any competitor into a different group.

Course information and other details are available in the Statistical Office.

NRA PPC Rule Book Production Semi-Automatic Pistol Specifications

PRODUCTION SEMI-AUTOMATIC PISTOL Rule 3

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Production Semi-Automatic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Pistols for this Division are approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions and listed on the Law Enforcement Competitions website. To be considered, must be a mass produced center-fire semi-automatic pistol made for police or military use (at least 1,000 pistols), unmodified stock catalog item in its original factory condition, and have a double, double/single, or striker type action. Must be capable of chambering and firing .35 caliber or larger ammunition, or FN 5.7 x 28 caliber ammunition. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double

action.

Trigger Pull Minimum: Single or Double Action	3.5 Pounds
Sight Radius Maximum	7.5 Inches
Installation of extended magazine releases and slide catches produced by the pistol's manufacturer.	Allowed
Replacement of the factory fixed or adjustable service sights with another service type sight, luminescent service sight, or fiber optic service sight sold by the pistol's manufacturer as a factory catalog replacement part for the pistol, or with a sight on the Production Semi-Automatic Pistol Approved Sight List on the NRA Law Enforcement Competitions website. In no case may the firearm be altered for any sight installation.	Allowed
Magazine bumper pads	Allowed
Finger groove and slip on grips	Allowed
Single Action Pistols	Prohibited
Custom or competition model Pistols, even if a catalog item or another version of the manufacturer's base stock model.	Prohibited

Distinguished Production Scores are reported using the NRA Distinguished Production Pistol Scorecard. It requires you to list your Production Pistol information and what page number your pistol is listed on in

NRA Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14-1.

Prior to shooting, Productions Pistols
Being used for Production Distinguished
matches must be INSPECTED and signed
off by a Tournament Official as meeting
specifications on your scorecard.

Scorecards are later reviewed by NRA LE Competitions before your score is validated and recorded.

Please take note that the NRA has made it clear that NO matter what APPROVED Replacement Sight is used, the sights MUST keep a <u>Duty Gun</u> Point of Aim/Point of Impact, NOT a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.

Pistols with competition sight set ups will be Disqualified, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresighter to check the sight set up.

Please note that you must record your sight information on your NRA

Distinguished Production Pistol Scorecard.

So if you have replaced the original sights make sure you know the name, model of the sights, and the page number they are listed as being approved in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 16-1.
