

# NRA TACTICAL POLICE COMPETITION - COURSE OF FIRE

<b>Course:</b> 6	<b>Course Name:</b> Backyard Dispute
<b>Course Type:</b> Scenario Based	<b>Start/Stop:</b> Shot Timer / Last Shot
<b>Targets:</b> 18 Paper	<b>Scoring:</b> TPC - Best 2 Hits on Paper
<b>Firearms / Rounds Required:</b> Duty Handgun = 8 Rounds / Patrol Rifle = 28 Rounds <b>MAXIMUM</b>	

**Start Position:** Duty handgun loaded and holstered. Standing with heels touching marks, Patrol Rifle loaded with a **MAXIMUM of 28 rounds** at Shoulder Ready. Slings may NOT be used during this course of fire.

**Course Description:** You just arrived at a residence in response to a caller complaining about his neighbor having a large party with people shooting off shotguns and handguns in the backyard and that shotgun pellets have struck his shed. You deployed with your Patrol Rifle but forgot to grab your rifle Grab-and-Go Bag so your ammunition is limited to what is loaded in the rifle. As you are moving to an opening in the fence to try to evaluate the situation you hear gunfire.

On the Start Signal, engage Threat Targets 1 thru 14 as seen with the rifle. When rifle goes empty immediately transition to handgun using muzzle DOWN transition technique and engage Threat Targets 15 thru 18 one handed with your handgun. Rifle targets engaged but missed, or that were not engaged because of running out of rifle ammunition may be engaged after transition with the handgun.

Two Procedural Penalties will be assessed for any of the following: using a sling for transition, firing handgun with two hands, or having more than 28 rounds of rifle ammunition loaded.
